Barb and all her helpers went above and beyond the call of duty.

As you know, we are jumping with both feet into more of the technological age. We have implemented online registration and the option for members to pay with a credit/debit card. In addition, we have put into action our Task Force which has our Tournament Office as its center.

There is something you can do which would help us out by alleviating some of the manual work we do. If you would **please post your scores online with GAM**, we would then have more woman power to deal with the tournament handicap issues. To make it simple I have numbered the steps that you need to take to accomplish this. It's easy once you have access, and after doing it a couple of times, you will be a pro. Much easier than golf! **HINT: The "Internet Explorer" browser seems to be the most compatible with the GAM website.**

1. Go to www.gam.org

Requesting Your Help

2. **IF** you **haven't registered** yet, click on the "Login" button. (It's in the gold bar under the heading "GET IN THE GAM"). Your login name is your first name and last name (all caps) plus 07 (Ex: JANEDOE07) Click "submit." At the bottom of this page you can edit (change) your login name and password. **IF** and when you're registered you can go to "Handicap" in the same gold bar and choose "Internet Posting" from the drop down list, put in your user name and password, and click "Submit."
3. Then click on "Post Score" (at the top of the page).
4. Select "Post A Score" (to the right of your name).
5. Select a State, put in the name of the course and click "Select" if the course name comes up automatically. Otherwise choose the course and click "Post-Unlisted Club."
6. Click "Submit" and select the tees you played from, fill in your adjusted score, etc. Click "Submit Score."

See it's as easy as 1, 2, 3.....4, 5, 6!

you happen to be one of the unlucky ones that has problems getting set up or accessing the GAM website, don't fear, just continue to send your posting cards via snail mail (2633 Candlewick, Lake Orion, MI 48359) or email (pringle@mwgolf.org) your scores to our Handicap Chair Deb Pringle.

The MWGA Board and especially the Task Force team will be eternally grateful if you will help us increase out Internet posting participation to 80% by the end of this season. Thank you in advance for your cooperation which helps us make MWGA the best women's golf club in the US!

THE MWGA State Championship — Open to All Members and Friends July 28-29, Hunters Ridge, Howell

Time is flying by so don't forget to sign up for the MWGA State Championship. There are a variety of player levels that participate from all over the Metro Detroit area, including both public and private clubs. Whether your handicap is 0 or 40, or you are 12 years old or 82, you will be able to test your tournament savoir-faire against players of your own skill level and age group.

The two-day MWGA State Championship will be held at Hunters Ridge Golf Course in Howell. Both Saturday and Sunday, July 28 and 29, will have 9:00 am Shotgun starts. Juniors will only play on Sunday. The women's divisions are flighted by age and handicap with gross and net prizes awarded. Combined scores from both days will be used to determine the final result.

GAM Honor Roll points (see the GAM website for information on Honor Roll points) will be awarded to the best gross finishers in each division. The overall medalist, if a member of the MWGA, will also be eligible to represent us at the GAM Chrysler Club Championship on October 1st to be held at the Eagle Eye and Hawk Hollow Golf Clubs in Lansing.

The entry fee of \$140 for members and \$160 for non-members includes cart, green fees, range balls, continental breakfast both days, lunch on Sunday, awards and prizes. Juniors will pay \$59 for their one-day event. There is no discount if you choose to walk. Hunters Ridge is located at 8101 Byron Road, Howell, MI 48855. Call 517-545-GOLF and mention the MWGA State Championship to reserve tee times for your practice round.

We will play from the women's middle tees: 72.4/127, 5557 yards. Hunters Ridge Golf Course is four star rated by Golf Digest. With its undulating topography amid thirty acres of natural wetlands, it is a must for every caliber of golfer. You can visit the website at:

Rules R Us

Improving Your Lie

Read Rule 13-2 and then take the following quiz to test your knowledge.

1. A player misses her ball on the tee shot and it falls off the tee. She presses down a divot on the teeing ground behind her ball. Is she penalized for improving her lie?
2. A player makes a stroke and then replaces his divot and other divots nearby. He then discovers his ball is OB and must drop in the area. Is he penalized for replacing the divots?
3. A player's ball comes to rest in front of a divot, which is folded over but not completely detached. The divot interferes with his backswing and he removes the divot. Is he penalized?
4. A player's ball comes to rest close to a putting green and he wishes to use his putter for his next stroke. May he repair a divot hole on his line of play with out penalty?
5. The balls of A and B lie near each other in the fairway. A plays and creates a huge divot in B's area of intended stance. B repairs the divot hole and plays. Is he penalized for improving his stance?
6. A player's ball is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the fairway. He lifted the ball and before dropping it, repaired the pitch-mark. Is he penalized?
7. A player is required to drop his ball in the fairway in a pile of sand deposited there when a fellow competitor in a previous group played his ball out of a nearby bunker. He brushes away the sand and drops his ball. Is he penalized for removing the sand?

Benefit of the Tournament Office — One control point for:

- 1) Tournament entries and payments
- 2) Handicap verification, flights, and prize structure
- 3) Game setup and signage
- 4) Gift certificates

Benefit of Prepaid Games

- 1) Saves Time - One of the things that requires so much time before and after our events is collecting and dividing money for the MWGA Games (Closest to the Flagstick, Chip-Ins, Longest Drive and Skins) If players prepay these games with their tournament entry, then payouts can be tallied and divided before the

day of the event. You will not have to arrive so earlier for check-in, and prizes can be given out much quicker at the conclusion of play.

- 2) Reduces errors — eliminates the after tournament rush and confusion in calculating the amounts for each game, getting change to make payments, etc. — the small errors that occasional occur will be greatly reduced.

Procedure to enter MWGA Tournament

- 1) Complete a Tournament Entry Form found in the *NEWSLINX*, on our web site at www.mwggolf.org, in your membership package or at our events. Please submit **one form per player**.
- 2) You can enter multiple tournaments on one form.
- 3) You can prepay tournaments and games.
- 4) If you do not post scores through MWGA you must provide the name of the organization you post with and the website where your current index can be found, along with your member number.
- 5) If you are mailing in your entry with a check and/or MWGA Gift Certificates, mail to:

Make sure that you do not touch your line with the putter to avoid a penalty.

2007 MWGA Tournament Guidelines

- 1) **Eligibility.** Tournaments are open to all female amateur golfers; mixed events are also open to amateur male golfers.
- 2) **Fees.**
 - A) The entry fee for each tournament will be the greens fees plus \$21 for four-person tournaments and \$18 for two-person and individual tournaments. \$15 and \$12, respectively, of this additional amount will be paid back in prizes. If food or other extras are going to be included at a tournament, the price of those items will be added to the entry fee, as well as projected expenses (postage, printing, etc.).
 - B) The entry fee for non-members will be \$20 more than the entry fee for members, unless designated otherwise; i.e., male partners in mixed tournaments playing with members will pay the member fee.
 - C) No fee refunds will be given after the entry deadline date.
- 2) **Flights.** All tournaments will have a minimum of two flights.
- 3) **Prizes.**
 - A) A minimum of one fourth of the field will receive prizes.
 - B) There will be an equal number of gross and net prizes, except that net prizes only will be paid in four-woman scrambles.
 - C) In order to be eligible for net prizes, a player must have a current, official USGA handicap index.
 - D) Each flight will get back a percentage of the prize money based on the percentage of entries.
- 4) **Contests.** Players will pay an additional fee for contests if they want to enter them. All money paid will be returned to the winners. Longest Drive \$1, (2) Closest to the Flagstick \$2, Chip-ins \$2 and Gross or Net Skins \$5 will be available at all tournaments. The tournament committee will run all contests. NOTE: Player's ball must be in the fairway and lying one to claim Longest Drive. Player's ball must be lying one and on the green to claim Closest to the Flagstick.
- 5) **Individual tournaments.**
 - A) Fees. See paragraph 1) above.
 - B) Prizes. In individual stroke tournaments, the recommended payout for first place is \$65. The number of entries will determine the number and amount of additional places paid. All prize money collected will be returned to players in prizes.
 - C) Flighting and Handicap. For flight position and handicap, a player's tournament handicap will be equal to 100% of the player's course handicap.
- 6) **Two-person team tournaments.**
 - A) Fees. See paragraph 1) above.
 - B) Prizes. In two-person events, the recommended payout for first place is \$55 (per person). The number of entries will determine the number and amount of additional places paid. All prize money collected will be returned to players in prizes.
- 7) **Four-person team tournaments.**
 - A) Fees. See paragraph 1) above.
 - B) Prizes. In four-person events, the recommended payout for first place is a range of \$40-\$50 (per person). The number of entries will determine the number and amount of additional places paid. All prize money collected will be returned to players in prizes.
 - C) Flighting and Handicap.
 - i) For flight position and handicap, a two-person scramble team's handicap will be calculated by taking 50% of the lowest course handicap and 25% of the highest course handicap.
 - ii) For flight position, a two-person best ball team's handicap will be calculated by taking 50% of the lowest course handicap and 25% of the highest course handicap. A two-person best ball team's handicap will be equal to 100% of each player's course handicap, with no restrictions on team handicap differential.
 - D) A two-person scramble team will be required to use each player's drive 6 times.
- 7) **Four-person team tournaments.**
 - A) Fees. See paragraph 1) above.
 - B) Prizes. In four-person events, the recommended payout for first place is a range of \$40-\$50 (per person). The number of entries will determine the number and amount of additional places paid. All prize money collected will be returned to players in prizes.
 - C) Flighting and Handicap.
 - i) For flight position and handicap, a four-person scramble team's handicap will be calculated on the following point system:

 - ii) For flight position, a best 2 of 4 team's handicap will be calculated by taking 20% of the lowest course handicap on the team, 15% of the next lowest course handicap, 10% of the next lowest course handicap and 5% of the highest course handicap. Each player will receive 100% of her handicap, with no restrictions, when determining hole-by-hole net scores.
 - D) A four-person scramble team will be required to use each player's drive 3 times.

Stop Check

Swing to the top of your backswing, then stop. Check for two things. First, your thumbs should be under the shaft and not out toward the sides. Second, see if your hands are over the tip of your right shoulder and not out further or set close to your head. Check this position every so often during the season.

Improving Your Lie

1. No, 13 -2 permits eliminating irregularities of surface on the teeing ground, whether or not the ball is in play.
2. No, when he replaced the divots, he was unaware he would be required to drop the ball in the area, and in equity (Rule 1-4), he is not penalized. If he wanted to play a provisional ball, he would not be allowed to fix the divots before playing.
3. Yes, the divot is not completely detached and is not a loose impediment. He is penalized 2 strokes.
4. No, he would be improving his line of play.
5. No, He is entitled to restore his stance to its original condition. In addition, if he cannot restore it, he may place his ball in the nearest spot within one club-length of the original lie no closer to the hole.
6. Yes, he improved his lie. If after dropping the ball, it falls into its own pitch-mark, he gets to re-drop. If it falls into another pitch-mark, he doesn't get relief and must either play the ball as it lies or take an unplayable.
7. Yes, sand is a loose impediment only on the putting green and he improved the area in which the ball was dropped.

MWGA INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Addendum to the Rules and Conditions of Play for MWGA Competitions

Prior to play beginning on the day of the event and at the course, the MWGA may make a determination to suspend or cancel play under, but not limited to, any of the following circumstances:

1. The golf course is deemed unplayable.
2. Lightning is present.
3. A 'dangerous situation' develops as defined by a majority vote of the MWGA Rules Officials, the MWGA Tournament Chair, any attending MWGA Tournament Committee Members along with the golf course management.
4. If it is a severely cold day, the wind temperature shall be checked 15 minutes in advance of the first tee time. If the temperature or wind chill is 40 degrees or less with no forecast of better conditions, play will be cancelled.

During competition, the host course or the MWGA will provide an "alarm" to notify players of suspension of play due to, but not limited to, any of the following circumstances:

1. Golf course becomes unplayable.
2. Lightning is present.
3. A 'dangerous situation' develops.
4. The temperature or wind chill drops to 40 degrees or less.

Once the alarm is sounded or players are notified by another means, players must mark their ball position, immediately cease playing and return to the clubhouse (or other noted area) to wait for further instructions.

During competition, if play is suspended, the MWGA Rules Officials, the MWGA Tournament Chair,

any attending MWGA Tournament Committee members along with the golf course management shall make the call as to when play will be resumed or cancelled.

After a delay in play, if play is deemed to be continued, the Committee shall give a minimum of 15 minutes advance notice for

MWGA cancellation of play either prior to play or after a suspension of play shall be determined by, but not limited to:

1. Combination of precipitation and cart path only
2. Temperature and wind chills detrimental to play

Please note: The MWGA will try to procure rain checks from the course when the MWGA cancels play. However, the final decision lies with the course management.
