Rules R Us *By Sara Wold*

New Rules for 2008

There are three significant new rules for 2008. Now a player can lift a ball in a hazard for identification using the usual procedure to do so. Previously, a ball could not be lifted in a hazard to identify it and, if the player hit a wrong ball out of a hazard, he was not penalized. In 2008, if a player hits a wrong ball out of a hazard, he will be penalized two strokes in stroke play and loss of hole in match play.

In 2008, if a player carries, but does not use a non-conforming club, it is not a disqualification, but a two stroke penalty per hole or 4 strokes per round.

An accidental deflection of his ball by the player, his caddy or equipment or his partner, or his partner's caddy or equipment is a one stroke penalty in 2008. Previously it was a two stroke penalty in stroke play or loss of hole in match play.

2008 USGA/PGA Rules Schools

The USGA/PGA Rules Schools to be held in 2008 at various locations can be found on the USGA website. The closest one to Michigan is in Milwaukee, WI March 16 - 19. The cost is \$250 to attend, and the USGA will send study materials to help prepare you for the course and the test. The MWGA will reimburse \$250 to anyone who attends and officiates 3 days of MWGA Tournaments. If you cannot attend, I suggest you attend the rules seminar that the GAM holds each spring. You will find information about the GAM seminars on the GAM website or in the *NEWSLINX* in the spring.

We definitely played two different styles of golf, as Kim hit her driver all day and blasted it 50-75 yards beyond me on every hole. Stacy Slobodnik-Stoll won the event with a great score of 69. The top four players qualified for the National Tournament of Club Champions in Naples, FL on December 7-9. The national event is held in conjunction with the Shark Shootout, an unoffi-

cial PGA team event. I am looking forward to traveling to Naples and competing in the stroke play event at the Tiberon Resort. The winner of the men's and ladies' events qualifies to play in the Bob Hope Chrysler Classic Pro-Am in Palm Desert.

It will be wonderful to represent Michigan as well as the MWGA at this prestigious event. I look forward to reporting back a successful result. Thank you to the MWGA for affording me this great opportunity.

The 2007 Chrysler Club Championship was an unbelievable experience. We played Tiberon Black course while the 24 pros in the Shark Shootout played the Gold course. Golf in the Emerald Isle *By Sara Wold*

On October 6th, Elaine Taylor and I along with David Graham, the Executive Director of the GAM, and 9 other GAM Governors and friends boarded a plane in Detroit for Shannon, Ireland. It was only 5 ½ hours to Shannon from Newark — similar to flying to the west coast. I dozed most of the time knowing that we would arrive in Shannon and proceed to Killarney to play a round of golf. We were met at the airport by Cathal O'Sullivan, a very energetic and happy Irish lad, who was the Sullivan Travel Agency, and who arranged every detail of our trip, and Mike Finn, our 24-seater bus driver. Dawn had broken and we had a short ride through the countryside to the famous Adare Manor for a wonderful Irish breakfast. We went directly to Killarney to play the Killeen Golf Club. It is a parkland style golf club similar to our courses in Michigan. The 1996 Curtis Cup was held there and the US lost 11.5 to 6.5. Betty Richart had attended and was happy we had the opportunity to play the course. That evening, after checking into the Randels Hotel,

which was ideally located in Killarney near restaurants, pubs and shopping, we had a lovely five course welcome dinner. During the cocktail hour, we were serenaded by a charming Irish duo of flute and violin. It was one of the very special touches that Cathal had arranged for us. Needless to say we slept very soundly after being up for about 34 hours!

Following breakfast we boarded our bus for a lovely ride through the famous Ring of Kerry countryside. The roads were very narrow and one had to wonder how the little cars squeaked by our bus in places. We played Waterville, which is rated the 6th best course in Ireland and 48th in the world outside the US by *Golf*

Digest. It is a true links course and, although one can hear about the Irish courses, one really has to experience them in person to really appreciate the beauty and difficulty of the links courses. It was truly a revealing experience for me. One of the most famous golf holes in the world is the Mass Hole. There was a time in Irish history that Catholics were forbidden to worship and the faithful would

gather in a depression between tee and green to worship. A watchman would sit on top of the tee and watch for the King's soldiers. It's a tough par 3 and I was the only one in our group to birdie it!

There is a quaint restaurant, The Smugglers Inn, adjacent to the clubhouse overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. It had closed the day before for the season but Cathal had managed to have it opened for us to have an unforgettable dinner. We looked out over the Ocean and a raging storm of wind and rain washed against the windows while we warmly recalled all our wonderful and woeful golf shots. Just as dessert was about to be served, the lights went out because of the storm and we had dessert by candlelight.

The 3rd day, we played Dooks Golf Club. It is also a links course but was not in as good condition as the others we had played. It rained all day and through to the 16th hole. We were soaked through and through but it was mild (low 70s)

with no wind. Mike, our driver, had arranged for us to have dinner in a famous pub in Killarney. It was especially fun because dining next to us was a group from Montreal, who were from the club that had recently hosted the President's Cup. There is a special bond, camaraderie, between golfers all over the world and a good time was had by all!

The 4th day was a free day and Elaine and I walked into town for shopping and lunch. Killarney is surprisingly a very sophisticated city with shops filled with internationally famous brands of linens, crystal, jewelry and couture fashions. In the evening we had dinner at a nearby pub and listened to Irish music.

The 5th day we drove to Ballybunion and played the Old Course, which is ranked number 1 in Ireland and 7th in the world. It looked like a bleak moonscape with long, heavy grass. It was very challenging with little room for error. There were numerous sod bunkers in the middle of the fairways. It was not in good condition and the clubhouse was unimpressive. It was, none the less, a privilege to play such a famous golf course. We had a lovely dinner in an elegant private dining room in a bed and breakfast afterwards.

The 6th day, we played Tralee Golf Club designed by Arnold Palmer. It is ranked number 6 in Ireland. It was another difficult links course. It was penal if you hit an errant shot, but there was a little more room for error. The scenery was outstanding with views of the Atlantic Ocean from nearly every

hole. We left Tralee to catch a ferry to cross the River Shannon, but it pulled out just as we were driving up; so we went to a nearby pub for a bowl of soup and some laughs with the locals. We caught the next ferry and drove to Lahinch and stayed at a luxurious hotel, the Vaughn Lodge. We had dinner in a nearby pub and were entertained by a six-piece Irish band.

The 7th day, we played Lahinch Golf Club, rated number 2 in Ireland and 23rd in the world. Holes 3 and 4 were very interesting. The second shot on number 3, a par 5, required one to hit over a high large mound to a green that was 150 yards past the mound. My caddie suggested I go around and I hit a good shot as directed and it ended up in a bunker, but I managed a bogie anyway. The 4th hole was a par 3. One had to hit over another high large mound (couldn't see the green). I hit short on top of the mound and the green was directly beneath me about 30 paces wide. Of course, I over shot the green and landed on top of the mound on the other side. I felt like the billy goats that wander the course. Another par 3 had an elevated tee with a deep depression filled with wavy grass to an elevated green. I almost got dizzy looking at the grass but managed to hit the green and get a par. After golf we drove to the Cliffs of Moor for a spectacular view of

We walked the courses and had caddies. Some were very good and others were so-so. I had really good caddies at Waterville and Lahinch, although both were also a bookie. Sports gambling is legal in Ireland. I didn't get good pictures because the sun was never shining, but the weather was mild and not too windy and we had rain only at Dooks.

We had a lovely farewell dinner at the Vaughn Lodge and left early the next morning for our flight back home. The trip cost was all inclusive and included airfare, hotels, transportation, all the breakfasts, the welcome and farewell dinners and all the green fees at the six courses, of which four are world-renowned. We paid had to pay for the extra meals, caddies and tips and a well-deserved tip for Mike, the bus driver. It was a trip of a lifetime, and I am anxious to return to play more Irish courses. Cathal O'Sullivan will be offering another trip to Ireland next October through the GAM and I heartily suggest you go.
